What is your favorite Christmas song or lyric?

Since we do not know who wrote Go Tell It on the Mountain we cannot be sure of its Biblical inspiration. But it is reasonable and even likely that it was inspired by two passages from the prophet Isaiah.

Read Isaiah 52:7-10. The prophet Isaiah is describing a specific time in Israel's history, and yet it points us current readers to a greater reality. How might the good news of God's reign have impacted it's original hearers? How does the good news of God's reign impact you today?

Read Isaiah 40:9. When was the last time you shared the good news? What obstacles or tensions are present for you when seeking to share the good news?

How did you hear about the good news?

Why is the good news good to you?

In a world of bad news we are called to be gospel people. What is a gospel person? How might you practice living as a person of the good news this week?

Pray together. Close by reading **Romans 10:14-15.**
