

PROVERBS: TAKING GOD AT HIS WORD

Life Group Questions | Sunday, September 6, 2020

Is there a key insight you are taking with you from these past 8 weeks in Proverbs?

Read Proverbs 30:1-6. What stands out to you from this passage? What do you think the author is trying to communicate?

In the above passage, the word “flawless” in Hebrew is a smelting term. It means fire-tested. The smelted put metal in fire to burn away the impurities, to get pure metal. God’s word is fire-tested. It is strong and sturdy like a refuge in a storm. Have you seen God’s word prove true in your own life? How so? What questions does this concept bring up for you?

Discuss the following Life Lessons. What practices come most naturally to you? What are most challenging? Why or why not?

- **Regularly engage God’s word.** (Matthew 4:4)
- **Trust God’s word above every other word.** (Psalm 146:3-5)
- **Do God’s word** (James 1:22)

Read Matthew 7:24-27. How does this story impact you? What does it mean to build your house on sand or rock? How does that choice present itself to you day to day?

Is there a decision you are facing this week—or perhaps an area of life in general—in which you can risk taking God at his word? What would that look like?

Pray together. Close by reading Proverbs 3:1-4.
